From the Pastor's Desk

I was deeply moved and challenged by the response of the members of the Emanuel A.M.E. church in Charleston. South Carolina after nine members of their parish community were shot and killed by a lone gunman. They preached forgiveness! I am not sure I would've been so ready to forgive. A grandson of Ethel Lane, one of the victims, declared: "She is a victim of hate, but she can be a symbol for love. That is what she was in life. Hate is powerful but love is more powerful." As Christians you and I are constantly called to be ministers of reconciliation and instruments of God's peace especially in the midst of violence and hatred.

Recently the Supreme Court has legalized samesex marriage. While we know that the Catholic Church officially does not recognize same-sex marriage, the important question now is how we respond officially and individually as Christians and Roman Catholics. Do we seek to be ministers of reconciliation or do we contribute to the climate of fear and hate that gay people have experienced throughout their lives. They have been victims of hate but they can also be symbols of love. Even if the Catholic Church does not officially recognize same-sex marriage we need to deal pastorally and loving with our gay and lesbian brothers and sisters as we all struggle to live out our common baptismal commitment.

I believe "central to our identity" as a parish is that we welcome all people. We are the open arms of Jesus on the cross in St. Francis church. We reach out and welcome all people, those who attend mass daily and those who come only on Christmas and Easter. We welcome those who have been estranged from the church because of divorce or sexual orientation or a bad experience in confession. I want all to continue to feel welcomed and nourished in our church. I would certainly make my own the words of Pope Francis: "Who am I to judge?" We are nourished and challenged at mass as we hear the word of God, break bread, sing praise to God and share peace with one another. We come with joy but also with broken lives.

Now What: Scripture Study

Our Catholic faith tradition holds Holy Scripture (the Bible) to be a "sacred deposit" entrusted to our Church. The Church as the magisterium protects the faith tradition and ensures this tradition is passed on to future generations. The principle of "actualization" allows for every text to be reread in the light of new conditions and circumstances applied to modern communities of faith. In a very practical sense, scripture continues to shed light on many current issues such as: caring for the poor, the protection of the unborn, protecting the environment and speaking out against violence and war. The Hebrew Scripture (Old Testament) is the record of the Jewish covenantal experience with Yahweh. For Christians, the Old Testament anticipates the coming of Christ. Through our faith in Jesus we have inherited the status of "a chosen people" and have entered a new phase in God's dealing with humanity; a "new covenant," a new dispensation. The New Testament writings provide the witness and testimony to Jesus' life, teachings and ministry. St. Augustine commented: "The New Testament lies hidden in the Old; the Old Testament is enlightened through the New." Scripture Study enriches your life, draws you closer to God and equips you with the tools to proclaim your faith to others.



In this year that St. Francis celebrates the 25th Anniversary of its Cub Scout Pack's (Pack 1385) founding, the Scouting Community at St. Francis will be establishing for the first time ever in the parish, a Boy Scout Troop (Troop **BOY SCOUTS 138)**, for boys from 11 to 17 years old. A small
