The Kairos Program is a prison ministry involving screened volunteers visiting adults who have been incarcerated. Its purpose is to build a Christian community within the prison. A Kairos weekend will be held at Sussex I State Prison on **October 19–22, 2017**. You can be a part of this expression of love in the following ways:

- Bake Cookies. Kairos volunteers are responsible for bringing dozens of cookies as a metaphor for abundant love. If this is something you desire to do, please use only the required recipes, due to the many prison restrictions. The <u>specific recipes</u> are available on the parish website <u>http://www.stfrncis.org/prison-ministry/</u> Any number of cookies are appreciated and they can be dropped off at the parish office on or before October 16th so they can be transported by Kairos volunteers the following morning.
- 2. **Sign up to Pray.** Intercessory prayer is powerful for those incarcerated as well as their families. The intent is to develop a list of names from our parish who will offer their prayers during the Kairos weekend. It is another way to demonstrate an outpouring of love.
