Did you know that technically there is no such thing as "Last Rites?" But the expression endures as the name of a sacramental celebration that people associate with death and dying. As priests we are often called, "Father can you come, my mom is dying and she

needs Last Rites?" And we are happy to do so, but.... let's take a moment to explore the sacramental celebration.

Technically, when people call for "Last Rites" they are calling for the "Continuous Rite" which is actually a celebration of three sacraments: Reconciliation, Eucharist, and Sacrament of Healing (also referred to as Anointing or Sacrament of the Sick). There is no need to wait until the loved one has slipped into a non-responsive condition. Under current guidelines, the celebration can be given at the onset of serious or terminal illness and does not need to be repeated once an individual is closer to passing. We would recommend to you that it is better to arrange for the priest to come earlier when the person is able to more actively participate—especially participation in Reconciliation and Eucharist.

There is also a practical matter: I-95 and Route 1. Many of our parishioners live south of the parish in Stafford County or closer to Fredericksburg. On one recent call to come to the house, it took almost two hours to arrive at the house (...and two hours travel back). Hospitals are a little different from home calls. If your loved one is a patient in one of the hospitals south of the parish, the priests of the local parishes are "on call "to administer the Sacrament of the Sick at those hospitals. They are able to arrive at the hospital in a matter of minutes.

SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

As Fr. John noted last week in his pastor's column, there is a lot of discussion about the Holy Eucharist among the U.S. Bishops, and partly because of a report from the Pew Foundation about what Catholics believe or accept regarding the

Catholic teaching about the Holy Eucharist. As it also happens, we are in Lectionary Cycle. Year B. in which the Gospel of Mark is our primary gospel for the Sundays of Ordinary Time. But Mark is the shortest of all the gospels and so it needs to be supplemented—and the church does so using the Gospel of John. Beginning Sunday July 25th and for the following four weeks, we will read from Chapter 6 of the Gospel of John, the "Bread of Life" discourse which is a theological view of the Eucharist. We will try to offer various articles from Catholic scholars to offer a broad understanding of the Holy Eucharist—more than what the Catechism of the Catholic Church offers (paragraphs 1322 and following)—which I would encourage you to take some time to read.

There are many names for this amazing Sacrament reflecting the inexhaustible richness of the Eucharist. The very name itself, Eucharist, means it is an action of thanksgiving to God with

eucharistein, the Greek word for "thanksgiving." It is called the "Lord's Supper" because of its connection to the Passover meal on the first Holy Thursday. The names are many: "breaking of the bread," "memorial of the Lord's Passion", "Holy Sacrifice," "Holy Communion," the "Real Presence" and more. And so often we think of these terms in individualistic terms—and it is an intense, personal experience with the Risen Lord when one receives the Eucharist. But it is also communal, or as the Church often calls it: ecclesiological – that which describes the Church.

One of the most common descriptions of the Church are the "four marks of the Church"—that which makes us what we are. It is part of the Nicene Creed we pray each Sunday: we are One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic. Let's quickly look at each of these terms.

We are One. "There is one body and one spirit," Paul wrote, "just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of us all' (Eph. 4:4-5). Paul linked this primitive unity to the Church's common Eucharistic bread: "Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of one bread" (1 Cor. 10:17). Jesus had promised at the outset that "there would be one flock, one shepherd" (John 10:16).

We are Holy. Does this mean that each and every Catholic is holy? Unfortunately, no. The Church is a holy institution made up of sinners. The Church is holy because Christ is holy. We have a responsibility to become holy. Holiness is meant for everyone. It is our responsibility to seek holiness in whatever place we find ourselves. If you are a nurse, God wants you to be a holy nurse. If you are an IT professional, God is calling you to be a holy technologist. If you work at a restaurant, God wants you to be holy in that job. Above all, we are all called to be holy in the context of our families.

We are Catholic. Did you know that technically you are part of the Latin Rite of the Catholic Church? Roman Catholic is just a convenient "nickname" so to speak. The word catholic in the Creed often throws people off. Some think that it's the name of our church. In the Creed, this word means "universal" from the Greek katholika. Jesus called his Apostles and disciples to "go and make disciples of all nations." And they did. Our Church still does. Our Church serves the needs of people around the world. This means that we don't simply belong to St. Francis in Triangle; we belong to a universal church that covers the globe. Anywhere there is a Catholic Church, we are home.

We are Apostolic. Christ Himself appointed the leaders of the early Church: his Apostles. Even as He was clearly aware of their faults, their doubts, their sins. Yet, Christ still told them they were to lead the Church.

The apostles were the first bishops, and, since the first century, there has been an unbroken line of Catholic bishops faithfully handing on what the apostles taught the first Christians in Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition (2 Timothy 2:2). These beliefs include the bodily Resurrection of Jesus, the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, the sacrificial nature of the Mass, the forgiveness of sins through the sacrament, baptismal regeneration, the existence of purgatory, Mary's special role, and much more—even the doctrine of apostolic succession itself.

These are the four marks of the Church. They are a means to understand the eucharistic ecclesiology of who we are. Cardinal Henri de Lubac, S.J., "The Eucharist builds the church and the church makes the Eucharist." Each was founded by Christ with a view to the other. Unless there were a church, there would be no one to celebrate the Eucharist, but unless there were a Eucharist, the church would lack the supreme source of its vitality. As Cardinal Avery Dulles writes: "The church renews itself by continually returning to the sources of its own life. By immersing itself in the Eucharist it takes on the characteristics of that great mystery of faith. Because the greater assimilates the lesser, the usual law of eating is reversed. In a famous passage, Augustine depicts Christ saying, 'I am your food, but instead of my being changed into you, it is you who will be transformed into me." As St. John Paul the Great points out in his encyclical, Ecclesia de Eucharistia, the Eucharist has the same four marks of the Church.






