Recently a number of individuals have come to me with their concerns as to the functioning of the sound system in the Church. Some have said that it is too loud, others have said it is not loud enough.

The problem is that of the design of the Church, as beautiful as it is, creates challenging acoustics. It is the combination of the hard surfaced tile floor, the wood ceiling, and the wooden oak pews.

The reason that the original pews had cloth seats was to help balance the sound in the Church.

We are planning to seek the advice of professionals as to the possibility of installing sound panels on the walls of the Church, similar to what is found in some concert halls.

What is holding us up right now is the cost. As you may be aware, because of COVID, and the months of no weekend Masses, our parish finances are "tight "right now.

Once we get beyond the situation with COVID, and return to a "sense of normal", we will proceed to get bids for these acoustic panels.

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

We have apps that monitor our sleep and calories, and remind us to get our steps in. Short on time? We order takeout or subscribe to a meal service. Yet, despite these modern conveniences, I would guess that most of us don't sleep enough or consistently eat well. And we pay the price, whether in the short or long term. Enter Elijah, who had reached his limit physically and mentally. Yet after an angel provided him food and drink, Elijah found the strength to walk 40 days and 40 nights. Impressive! But that's God for us! And in the provision of his Son, we have food and drink – bread from heaven – that not only sustains us for our journey on earth but offers the possibility of eternal life. This is our belief; this is what Jesus says to us. And that alone can give us strength, and hope, even when we're having an "Elijah" moment. For at each and every holy Mass, Jesus invites us to the table, offering us food that not only sustains but also transforms us. Taste and see the goodness of the Lord, indeed!

#### GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Just as a good night's sleep and proper nutrition help us function our best, the Word of God and the Eucharist, and our communal life of faith, provide the spiritual nourishment we need as we strive to be imitators of God in our daily lives, as Saint Paul says. As we partake of Christ in the Eucharist, perhaps we can say a prayer of thanksgiving and ask Jesus to help us grow in the ways of love that Paul outlined: kindness, compassion, and forgiveness toward the people we encounter. It could mean letting go of a grudge, becoming more conscious of the needs of others, listening respectfully to someone with whom we disagree, or perhaps forgiving ourselves. The Holy Spirit will guide us.

**REFLECT** Think about the ways the Mass transforms you. It may be something subtle - the spirit of consolation and the feeling that things are right in your world - or you may have been particularly moved by the readings, homily, music, or silent prayer. Tell someone about it!

# The Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist

In our previous article we addressed how "transubstantiation" was an apt description of "how" the bread and wine

become the Precious Body and Blood of Jesus—and noted along with the 13<sup>th</sup> Session of the Council of Trent, that the real "ancient and true" teaching was that of the Real Presence. So... what do we mean by the Real Presence?

As the Gospel of Matthew tells us:

While they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples said, "Take and eat; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins. (Mt 26:26-28) (with similar language in Mk 14:22-24, Lk 22:17-20, and 1 Cor 11:23-25)

It is based on the ancient understanding of those Scriptures and the Sacred Tradition which handed on that understanding, that the Catholic Church professes that in the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest. And still, we want to know how. St. Ambrose says about this becoming:

Be convinced that this is not what nature has formed, but what the blessing has consecrated. The power of the blessing prevails over that of nature, because by the blessing nature itself is changed... Could not Christ's word, which can make from nothing what did not exist, change existing things into what they were not before? It is no less a feat to give things their original nature than to change their nature.

That understanding is further enhanced by the Gospel of John, Chapter 6, the *Bread of Life Discourse*, in which Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world... For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink" (Jn 6:51-55). From this the Church has always understood that the whole Christ is truly present, body, blood, soul, and divinity, under the appearances of bread and wine. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

Paragraph 1374 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church beautifully explains: "...In the most blessed sacrament" of the Eucharist "the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained." "This presence is called 'real'—by which is not intended to exclude the other types of presence as if they could not be 'real' too, but because it is presence in the fullest sense: that is to say, it is a substantial presence by which Christ, God and man, makes himself wholly and entirely present."

St. John Chrysostom understood what the Church means when it declares "Christ...makes himself wholly and entirely present." Chrysostom wrote:

It is not man that causes the things offered to become the Body and Blood of Christ, but he who was crucified for us, Christ himself. The priest, in the role of Christ, pronounces these words, but their power and grace are God's. This is my body, he says. This word transforms the things offered.

Not long after I was ordained a friend asked me "how it felt to have the power to make the Eucharist?" I understood the question was really, "what it like the first time you celebrated the Mass." But sometimes our language betrays some of our "soft" thinking about the Eucharist. I have no power to "summons" Jesus body and blood, soul and divinity to our celebration of the Eucharist. I do have the promise of Christ, his instructions on what we are do, and the Sacred Tradition of how o understand it all—and then I can pray, "By the power of the Holy Spirit...." Maybe simply said: "Lord, you promised, I believe and because of that belief I trust that you will fulfill your promises to be really present—wholly and entirely present—body and blood, together with the soul and divinity.


