JOHN 8:58, MALACHI 3:1-6

What assurance that brings. I Am. He was there in the beginning and He will be there in the end. His great kindness to us is that His plan always included Jesus, the son of God. DAY 1

Morning

REVELATION 22:16

Jesus is the source of all light, the most holy and powerful light. He is our point of reference and the promise of a new day, grace, and that better is coming. What joy that we get to be partakers of His promises as He has extended to us an invitation to come and behold the promises and beauty of the Gospel.

DAY 2

Shepherd

JOHN 10:14-15

As Christians, we become a follower of Jesus and He is our Shepherd of our life. A shepherd will provide protection, rest, and nourishment for his sheep. Jesus does the same. He has given us life abundant as He laid down His life so that we would have the promise of eternal life and relationship with God. As His sheep, we are to have a discerning ear and obedient heart.

DAY 3

The Gate

JOHN 10:7

ISAIAH 28:16

DAY 5

Prince of Peace

ISAIAH 9:6, PHILIPPIANS 4:7

DAY 7

JOHN 1:14, JOHN 1:1

DAY 6

DAY 8

Servant

ISAIAH 52:13

A servant is someone who performs duties on behalf of another and Jesus is the the greatest of examples. His life on earth was constantly serving those around Him and carrying out the duties that no one else was willing to do. And beyond that, Jesus carried our griefs and sorrows to the cross as the substitute, giving up His life for ours. He died for our transgressions so that we might walk in freedom and truth. And as we do walk in His light, He is exalted.



A horn here represents a few things--honor, plenty, and power. Honor comes from this salvation being raised up above any other, where all others are incomparable and the glory of the Redeemer and the redeemed are advanced. A horn represents a cornucopia of plenty; an abundance of blessing. And lastly, the power of the horn is seen as the strength of any beast who because of it has the ability to conquer using it as it's weapon of strength. There is victory and God has used Jesus to secure and deliver us from our enemies as we walk in obedience to Him. Jesus is our spiritual conqueror, trust in Him.

DAY 11

Messiah

MATTHEW 1:18-25

Jesus was the long expected Jewish ruler that would bring deliverance and establish God's rule. He was the prophecy fulfilled— the Messaiah would be a descendant of David, born of a virgin in Bethlehem, and God's Anointed. As we trust Christ, He secures for us the promises of God and salvation comes only through Him.

DAY 13

Land of God

JOHN 1:29

In the Old Testament, lambs were offered as daily sacrifices for sin and here we see that Jesus is God's lamb for the world. The Great Sacrifice.

Jesus was without blemish and through the merit of His death, removes our guilt and sin. His sacrifice leads us to sanctification and eternity with Him in Heaven.

Prophet

LUKE 24:19

Jesus is spokesperson for God, a proclaimer of the will of God and foretold the future. He acted as a messenger. Matthew 16:21—He performed miracles and healings, and fulfilled the prophecies and promises.

DAY 12

King of the Jews

MATTHEW 2:1-2

Jesus was not an earthly king in terms to overrule Rome, however a divine kingship (John 18:36). The origin of kingship in Israel dates back to Samuel in the Old Testament when Samuel retired, the people desired a king to govern rather than God. Jesus establishes the kingdom of God that will always reign and after His resurrection, Jesus took His throne at the right hand of God.

DAY 14

Mediator

1 TIMOTHY 2:5

Jesus brings about internal and spiritual transformation by the blood of the covenant. This purchase has been made through the fulfillment of promises and prophecy. He has gone before us, stepped in on our behalf to reconcile the brokenness of sin. Our God did not desire the destruction and His eternal wrath for all, but rather life and life abundant. LUKE 1:35

DAY 21

JOHN 14: 6

Jesus made this promise and fulfilled it. He purchased our forgiveness through His death on the cross. A man innocent of all evil and sin. His self-sacrifice removes our sin and allows us to have a relationship with God, the Father.

DAY 20

EDUESIANS 1.7

Through the death and resurrection Jesus reclaimed us. Salvation offers union with Christ and abundant life. He gave His life to be the propitiation for our sin, where our faults and failures would separate us from the Lord, yet He has provided the sacrifice required for us to be in communion with God, the Almighty.



LUKE 2:11
