Stewardship, which in simple terms, is the act of putting God's priorities before our own. Good Stewards do four things: receive God's gifts gratefully, nurture those gifts, share the gift justly and charitably and return those gifts to God abundantly. I hope that I have done those things well and freely in my priestly and Franciscan life.

Like you, God has given me 168 hours each week. Clearly, I spend a great deal of time at church and doing

parish things, so you might be thinking, "that makes it pretty easy to tithe 10% of his Time to God." If tithing means to give God the first and the best, recognizing that God is the owner, and we are only the managers of his time, am I doing that? Or do I give to God what's left over at the end of a long and busy day? Is my own use of Time a sign of my love to give the first and the best to God? Am I a person who is a good steward of God's time? It is not a simple calculation of "how many hours do I work in the parish?" Am I fully engaged in celebrating Mass or is my mind racing with a list of things that needs to be done? (Sound familiar?) Do I carry a compassionate heart and pay attention when speaking with a parishioner, even as I see someone else I really wanted to talk with? I could go on, but I think you get the point. Where and when are moments that I have given God the first and best? Do I have 16.8 hours per week of tithing my time to God?

Like you, God has gifted me with a varied professional life, education, and a reservoir of experiences in life. With almost 30 years of life experience in the working world and education, I have learned some things along the way. I'm not too sure my nuclear-power submarining technical skills come into play here in the parish, but there were certainly experiences during my naval service that contribute to the person I am today. My years of volunteering at parishes along the way contributed to my discernment of where my Talents might best serve the parish. Leading Bible studies was revealed as a passion to make the stories of Sacred Scripture engaging. Celebrating the Sacraments, a joy. Being assigned to parishes of good and faithful people – priceless. I hope that I share my gifts and return them to God in abundance.

If the above talks about being a good steward of my Time and Talent, that leaves only Treasure. As Franciscans we are required to give away our worldly wealth before our final vows and we may not give it to the Province! In distributing my wealth, I hope I did well in being just and charitable in sharing God's gifts. So, all done, yes? Not really. If I want to be a good steward of my Treasures I have to ask myself if I continue to be a good steward of my treasures – even though the amounts are very different now. I receive a monthly stipend and gifts from parishioners. I have the same challenges as you. Did I receive the gifts gratefully, do I nurture them, share them and return them to God? I try to do those things. As an individual I contribute to Offertory, charity and more.

Friars, staff, parishioners – all of us who make up the Catholic community of St. Francis — we are all called to live as good stewards, to put God's priorities before our own. We are called to receive, nurture, share, and return the gifts which God gives so abundantly. This is what it means to begin to live life as a good Steward of the Time, Talent and Treasures given. It is a way of living in the world. It is a spiritual stance in the midst of our incredibly busy lives.


The start of St. Francis being a Stewardship Parish is for each one of us to be good Stewards in our own lives.

From the Friars

Dear parishioners,

The report of the summary of the Synodal process of the Catholic Church in the US is now available on our parish website. I would strongly encourage you to read it. It has

many positive things to say about the Church in the U.S. and offers great hope for the future in several areas. Having said that, it should also be noted that it does not shy away from describing the challenges which lie before us as Church. I know when this process was first announced that some thought it would avoid dealing with the tough issues facing the Church. It did not!

One section speaks of the polarization in the Church, even among the Bishops. It speaks of the negative impact of the COVID pandemic on parish life. It speaks of the need to be a more welcoming Church. An example: "People noted that the Church seems to prioritize doctrine over people, rules and regulations over lived reality". Another sentence from the report says, "Persons who have been divorced, whether remarried or not, often feel unwelcome within the Church". It speaks of how people of color routinely encounter racism in the Church. It mentions that there is "a real crisis" as to how to minister to the LGBTQ+ community, some of whom are members of our own families. Often families remain torn between remaining in the Church and supporting their loved ones.

It encourages Church leadership and laity to celebrate the positive but also to confront these challenges, to work together to create a stronger Catholic church in the U.S. and to do this through ongoing attentive listening, respectful encounter, and prayerful discernment.

Please try to take the time to read the entire report. It is a sobering and transparent look at where we are as a Church today.




Respect Life Ministry - Time for a New Vision

Now that the Supreme Court has overturned Roe v. Wade/Dobins, one of the major objectives of the Respect Life Ministry (RLM) was achieved—at least at a national level. Now the attention turns to the Commonwealth of Virginia and its policies about abortion and assisted suicide. But there is also space and energy to address the full scope of what it means to truly be Pro-Life. The US Catholic Bishops list the following as central pro-life issues: Life and Dignity of the Human Person; Call to Family, Community, and Participation; Rights and Responsibilities; Option for the Poor and Vulnerable; The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers; Solidarity: one human family; and Care for God's Creation.

The current ministry leader, Angie Powell, has asked to step down. We are grateful for her leadership over the last several years. Now, the RLM seeks to engage a new leadership <u>team</u> to help re-vision the ministry in order to best engage the changing culture and landscape of being authentically Pro-Life.


