Cities in the Biblical Story

■ Violence and War

- Jericho, Ai, Canaanite armies ... lots of conflict
- How can we understand?

■ A history of cities

- Jericho – the first city encountered since leaving Egypt
- Biblical cities associated with evil – e.g. first city build by Cain

■ Cities (*continued*)

- Cities associated with kings and evil
 - Babylon and Nineveh
 - Sodom and Gamorrah
 - ...even Jerusalem
- Cities - where evil resides in the Biblical story and is often associated with the "king" who would assume "god" status
- Jericho – Canaanites (moral corruption and child sacrifice)

Holiness and Witness

■ Some Key Ideas to this Point

- Holiness and presence of God among the people
- Ritual and Moral purity
- Covenant
 - Right relationship, and
 - Witness
- Shema
 - “listen O Israel”
 - Hear
 - Obey
- What would it mean to have Jericho remain as the city/source of evil?

■ Jericho – actor and witness

- Israel relies on God for victory
- On the 7th day, a new creation
- Law of *herem* (no one grows rich from way) is a stipulation to possess the land
- Goal of the Book of Joshua
 - Not how to conquer the land
 - How to avoid losing the land
 - Written long after the period
 - cautionary tale about what the people are to do and not do in order to avoid the fate of the Northern Kingdom in losing the land (see Dt 7:1-6)
 - Language is stylistic and hyperbolic
