

The Solution: Crisis Now Model



Crisis Receiving Centers: Urgent Care for Mental Health & Substance Abuse

- Brick & mortar centers, open
 24/7
- Staffed by behavioral health professionals
- Police & general public drop-off
- Take anyone ("no wrong door")







CRC Impact

An analysis of the crisis system in Maricopa County, Arizona, which relies heavily on CRCs, estimated that a \$100 million investment in crisis care resulted in savings of:

- → \$260 million in psychiatric inpatient spending
- → \$37 million in ED costs
- → 45 years of ED psychiatric boarding hours
- → 37 full-time equivalents (FTEs) of police officer time and salary

 - Connection to wraparound services
 - Regional facility
